ECONOMIC

Innovate with NBN - NEW

Agency: NBN

Closing: 12 October 2026

Eligibility: Digital businesses or organisations connected to the NBN network located in regional Australia

Awards are available for one standout business or organisation in each category who can demonstrate:

- making the most of the nbn® network to help enable regional Australians to live, learn and work in a digital society
- challenging the traditional markets in regional Australia
- lifting digital participation and stimulating regional economies
- championing digital adoption for regional and remote communities

\$15,000 available to one standout business or organisation in each category:

- AgTech and Environment
- Arts, Culture & Tourism
- Education
- First Nations Business
- Health and Wellbeing
- Innovation for Productivity
- Women in Regional Business

An award of \$20,000 to the 2026 Innovate with nbn® Champion is also available.

Active Transport Fund

Agency: Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications, Sport and the Arts.

Closing: 30 September 2026

Eligibility: State Government Departments and Local Government Authorities. Community/sporting organisation can partner with State and Local Government.

The Program funds construction only projects, and design and construction projects for active transport (mainly walking and bike paths). Construction can include new builds, as well as the upgrade and/or replacement of an existing pathway. Maintenance projects are ineligible.

The program has three objectives:

- road safety
- reducing transport emissions
- active and liveable communities.

It is a 50/50 funding with the Commonwealth contributing a maximum of \$5M.

Examples of eligible projects:

- widening or realignment of existing pathways that are associated with a road
- new pathways that run alongside or on a road providing users physical separation from vehicular traffic
- bicycle paths – bicycle-only facilities providing separation from people walking and motor vehicles –
- shared-user paths
- a pedestrian crossing connecting new or existing pathways that improves connectivity and supports safer active transport outcomes.

CSIRO Kick Start – Research and Development

Agency: Australian Government – CSIRO

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility:

- Be an operating business with an Australian Company Number (CAN) or Indigenous Corporation Number (ICN).
- Be a non-tax-exempt company that is registered for GST.
- Less than \$10M in turnover or operating expenditure or less than 3 years trading

Projects will be developed between the company and the relevant CSIRO researcher(s).

Eligible projects must include one of the following activities:

- Research into a new idea or discovery with commercial potential
- Development of a novel or improved product or process
- Testing of a novel product, developed by the company, to inform research and development activities.
- Be delivered by CSIRO business units and/or facilities.
- Be less than 1 year in length

Matched funding to access two CSIRO vouchers between \$10K- \$50K each

Rural Support Grant SA – Small Business

Agency: Government of South Australia – Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA)

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: SA primary producers and rural small businesses experiencing significant financial hardship.

Funding of up to \$1,500 available in conjunction with financial counselling through Rural Business Support (RBS). The grant helps cover essential costs such as utilities, council rates, groceries, medical bills, or other items identified by the financial counsellor and the individual as part of their recovery planning.

Priority is given to those impacted by drought, algal bloom, market disruptions (such as in the wine grape industry), biosecurity incursions, and family-run rural small businesses concerned about their financial future.

PRIMARY PRODUCTION

Grazing Management Grant – NEW

Agency: Landcare Australia

Closing: 21 September 2026

Eligibility: Primary producers

The Grazing Management Grant will assist primary producers in the Northern and Yorke Landscape Board (NYLB) region to undertake fencing and/or water infrastructure projects to improve grazing practices (e.g. implement rotational grazing).

Priority will be given to applicants not having received an on-farm dry time grant from the Northern and Yorke Landscape Board in 2024, 2025 or 2026, however previous recipients are welcome to apply and will be assessed subject to funding availability.

The maximum funding (GST exclusive) available to primary producers is \$10 per hectare improved up to a maximum of \$5,000. Grazing practices must be improved to a minimum level at or comparable to halving the duration of grazing in the paddock(s). E.g. installing fencing to split a 500ha paddock in half would be eligible for up to \$10 x 500ha = \$5,000.

Regional Capability Community Fund Round 5 - NEW

Agency: Government of South Australia – Country Fire Service (CFS)

Closing: 18 September 2026

Eligibility:

- individual farmers
- farming businesses or rural landholders
- applicants must have current FFU registration

The Regional Capability Community Fund (RCCF) Round 5 provides \$500,000 in State Government funding to support eligible South Australian landholders to improve farm firefighting capability, safety and preparedness.

Eligible items applied for in the application must be intended purchases and not items already purchased. Applicants may apply under one funding stream only.

Round 5 funding is available for the following equipment categories:

- **Farm Fire Unit (FFU):** eligible items include new FFUs that align with CFS guidance and meet relevant South Australian requirements. The maximum reimbursement is \$5,000 per successful applicant.
- **Safety Equipment:** eligible items include heat shields, woollen fire blankets, rotating amber beacons, first aid kits with burns kits, and fire-rated personal protective clothing. The maximum reimbursement is \$1,000 per successful applicant.

- **Other Equipment:** eligible items include hose and/or branch, water pumps, water tanks with a minimum capacity of 400 litres and a fill point, and UHF/CB radios. The maximum reimbursement is \$1,000 per successful applicant.

Rural Support Grant SA – Primary Production

Agency: Government of South Australia - Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA)

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: SA primary producers and rural small businesses experiencing significant financial hardship.

Funding of up to \$1,500 available in conjunction with financial counselling through Rural Business Support (RBS). The grant helps cover essential costs such as utilities, council rates, groceries, medical bills, or other items identified by the financial counsellor and the individual as part of their recovery planning.

ENVIRONMENTAL

2027 Bob Hawke Landcare Award – NEW

Agency: Landcare Australia

Closing: 31 January 2027

Eligibility: To be eligible, nominees must meet the following criteria:

- **Individual nominee:** Australian citizen actively engaged in landcare and sustainable agriculture.
- **Group nominee:** An Australian community-led group including landcare groups, landcare networks, farming system groups.
- **Organisation nominee:** Australian-owned, not-for-profit, non-government entity, demonstrating leadership in natural resource management and sustainable agriculture.
- **Involvement:** Actively participating in landcare activities and sustainable agriculture initiatives.
- **Commitment:** Demonstrated dedication to environmental stewardship and promoting sustainable practices.
- No self-nomination. Nominations can only be made by a third party

The Bob Hawke Landcare Award is a prestigious national award that publicly recognises an individual, group or organisation that has been involved in championing landcare and inspiring others to take action on their property or in their community.

The Bob Hawke Landcare Award recipient will be awarded a grant package to the value of \$30,000 (ex GST) for further development of their knowledge and skills in sustainable land management to enable an even stronger contribution to landcare.

Bite-sized Grants - **NEW**

Agency: Landscape South Australia Northern and Yorke

Closing: Until end April 2027 unless funding is exceeded earlier

Eligibility: Incorporated not-for-profit groups including, but not limited to Land, Coast, and Bushcare groups, Friends of groups, farming groups and schools.

Eligible projects will contribute to one or more of the priorities of the Northern and Yorke Landscape Board:

- Pest Plant and Animal Control
- Sustainable Agriculture
- Water Management
- Biodiversity
- Communities

A diverse range of activities can be funded which contribute to increasing awareness and positive action by communities in landscape management. This may include purchasing tools, equipment or consumables, hiring contractors, design or printing costs, presenter fees, purchasing native plants, and purchasing safety gear etc

Grants range between \$200 and \$2000

COMMUNITY

NAB Foundation Community Grant

Agency: NAB

Closing: 14 September 2026

Eligibility:

- Charities registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for Profits Commission (ACNC).
- Social enterprises (not-for-profit and for-profit) or start-ups with social or environmental impact at the core of their business.
- Groups or organisations (not-for-profit and for-profit) that hold an Australian Business Number (ABN) and have a charitable purpose.
- Local government or government-funded facilities (such as a school or childcare centre) seeking funding for a program that furthers charitable purpose.

Your organisation doesn't need to have Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status.

The NAB Foundation Community Grants program provides funding of up to \$25,000 for local projects that help communities withstand and recover from natural disasters.

NAB Foundation Community Grants support community-led projects that relate to the following categories:

- **Training and planning**

Educational workshops, practical and strategic planning that help communities prepare for a natural disaster.

- **Community Recovery**

Programs to enhance community connection, resilience and wellbeing post natural disaster.

- **Environment and wildlife**

Restoration of damaged vegetation and habitat, and rehabilitation of injured wildlife.

- **Equipment and Infrastructure**

Tools, equipment and infrastructure improvements that help communities withstand natural disasters or recover in their aftermath.

Hallet Community Grant

Agency: Energy Australia

Closing: 30 September 2026

Eligibility: Community groups and Local Government for the districts of Regional Council of Goyder, District Council of Peterborough and Northern Areas Council.

\$10,000 available in community grant funding and a total of \$10,000 in small sponsorship funding.

Opened to a wide range of local community projects with the total value from \$1,000 to \$10,000 .

Real School Grant

Agency: Real Insurance

Closing: 1 October 2026

Eligibility: Associated with an Australian public school (school) or a school-group or a school association

To apply for the Grant, you will need to write a description (maximum 700 words) on what your school and/or school-group would do with the allocated grant and how it will benefit your students and community. Total grant value of up to AUD \$5,000 in a financial year.

Modernised Multicultural Grants Program: Infrastructure for Multicultural Communities

Agency: Department of Home Affairs

Closing: Batch 2: 12 November 2026

Eligibility: To be eligible you must be:

- a not-for-profit organisation
- a legal entity with the capacity to enter into a legally binding grant agreement with the Commonwealth; and
- one of the following entity types:
 - Company
 - Cooperative
 - Incorporated Association
 - Indigenous Corporation
 - Statutory Entity.

The grant opportunity is comprised of two funding opportunities, called batches. You can apply for funding in one batch.

- Batch 2 opens on 18 May 2026 and closes on 12 November 2026.

The following groups and projects will be prioritised for funding:

- new and emerging multicultural communities.
- projects focussed on achieving positive outcomes for multicultural women, multicultural LGBTIQ+ community members, and multicultural people with a disability.

Co-contributions are required towards the value of your project and the minimum amount of co funding is determined by whether you are applying as a priority group/project or other.

The objectives of the grant opportunity are to:

- deliver physical infrastructure to support multicultural communities connect and commune in a designated physical environment
- provide co-funding to deliver community-focussed infrastructure and amenities
- provide infrastructure and amenities that benefit the wider multicultural community by improving equity and social inclusion.

Petstock Foundation Grant Program

Agency: Petstock

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Direct Gift Recipient (Charity)

- Assist abused, abandoned and neglected pets through rescue, rehabilitation and/or rehoming initiatives.

- Support those who require assistance within our communities through companion animal projects and disaster assistance.
- Raise awareness about rescue pets, animal health and the impact of animals on human happiness and health.

Community Sponsorship Fund - Whyte Yarcowie Wind Farm

Agency: Wind Prospect

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility:

- Community-serving, incorporated not-for-profit organisation
- Geographic proximity to the project

While most of the benefit sharing programs will not commence until the wind farm has been approved, the annual Community Sponsorship Fund is in operation and applications are welcome. The fund provides an annual fund of \$10,000 per year to assist community groups and organisations that operate in the vicinity of the proposed wind farm to improve their services, programs, initiatives and/or facilities.

- Fund of \$10,000 per calendar year
- Initially, funding totalling \$2,500 will be granted each quarter (to a total of \$10,000 per calendar year)
- Grants greater than \$2,500 may be awarded, at the discretion of Wind Prospect.

ABC Future Fund

Agency: ABC Foundation Ltd

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Aboriginal organisations with an ABN from remote and regional areas.

Funding is available for projects aligned with the Future Fund focus areas, such as On-Country Education, On-Country Care, and On-Country Research & Development.

The fund also offers small one-off event grants of up to \$2,500 per applicant for community-centred activities.

Inclusive Neighbourhoods

Agency: Julia Farr McLeod Benevolent Fund

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Social purpose organisations (including not-for-profits, social enterprises, universities and governments) who demonstrate an existing commitment to inclusion through engagement of people with disability in recognised roles in governance and/or workforce.

This grant funds initiatives by organisations that develop policy or practice relating to the inclusion of people living with disability.

Grants can be used for

- Salaries and on costs
- Costs of setting up your project, such as recruitment and training
- General operating costs directly related to the project
- Organisation overheads related to the project
- Honoraria/gifts for people participating in the program, for example in governance, codesign, or advisory groups
- Event costs
- Marketing costs
- Monitoring and evaluation
- Capital costs to support project delivery (e.g. laptops etc, rather than fixed assets)

Amount: Grants range in size between \$8,000 and \$230,000. Multi-year grants can be made available, up to a maximum of three years.

SPORTS AND LEISURE

Active Club Program - **NEW**

Agency: Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing

Closing: 14 October 2026

Eligibility: To be eligible for the ACP, applicants must:

- be a not-for-profit active recreation or sport club or community organisation whose primary purpose is the delivery of active recreation or sport programs and services in South Australia; or
- be a not-for-profit recreational fishing club whose primary purpose is the delivery of recreation programs and services in South Australia; and
- be incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1985 (SA), and
- have a minimum total membership base of 20 members. Total membership can include associate, social and life membership, and
- be operating for 12 months or longer.

The objective of the ACP is to provide funding support to active recreation, sport and recreational fishing clubs to further develop the programs, services and small-scale infrastructure improvements that enhance participation and strengthen club capacity within the South Australian community.

Grant amounts

Less than 100 members: \$1,500

100 or more members: \$3,000

AFL Breaking New Ground

Agency: AFL

Opening: Ongoing

Eligibility:

- Schools
- Local governments,
- Developers,
- Community
- Australian football clubs

The objectives of the program are to:

- Develop increased supply through the construction of new ovals, especially in growing communities.
- Increase the AFL facility network in areas of need, by maximising the carrying capacity and accessibility of new places to play and the quality/functionality of supporting infrastructure.
- Provide inclusive and accessible facilities that cater for the diversity of participants, particularly females, who wish to participate in the game.
- Enable planning and project partnerships to form with a range of government and non-government bodies to result in an improved quantity, quality and welcoming venue network for Australian football.

Funding Available: Up to \$50,000 for planning and up to \$200,000 for project delivery.

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Disadvantaged communities

The Roger Rasheed Sports Foundation is a not-for-profit charity that provides sports facilities and opportunities for extreme disadvantaged communities across Australia. The Foundation wants to ensure that children, regardless of background or circumstance, have the opportunity to enjoy all that sport has to offer.

HEALTH AND WELL BEING

Julia Farr Disability Inclusion Grants (Round 1) 2026–2027 - **NEW**

Agency: Government of South Australia – Department of Human Services

Closing: 16 October 2026

Eligibility:

- Incorporated non for profit organisations
- Local Government
- Social enterprises

This funding round is designed to support eligible organisations in delivering initiatives that improve the lives of South Australians living with disability. Funding will be prioritised for projects that develop programs, activities, events or other support services that respond to community need, promote participation, accessibility and inclusion and build, develop or strengthen partnerships or collaboration with other community organisations to deliver these initiatives.

Applications that demonstrate how they fill a service gap, particularly in regional and remote areas, will be viewed favourably.

- Tier 1: Up to \$20,000 delivered over 12 months
- Tier 2: Up to \$100,000 delivered over 24 months.

Ski for Life

Agency: Ski for Life

Closing: Round 3 - 31 October 2026

Eligibility: Project programs much impact directly on communities throughout regional, rural and/or remote Australia.

- Have an Australian Business Number (ABN) or a recognised relationship with a legal entity (i.e., organisation or company with an ABN), to ensure the project will be appropriately managed.
- Be able to complete the project within 12 months from the receipt of funding.
- Not have started the project, funding will not be provided retrospectively.

Helps communities, groups and individuals undertake projects which raise awareness and promote mental health, wellbeing and suicide prevention. Grants are accessed in multiple rounds each year:

Round 2	1 st May	31 st July	31 st August
Round 3	1 st August	31 st October	30 th November

Australian Lions Wellbeing Grants

Agency: Australian Lions Wellbeing Foundation

Closing: Ongoing.

Eligibility:

- Schools,
- Lions Clubs
- Community groups

Projects which help to increase the wellbeing of your community in your local area and are conducted in an alcohol and drug-free space will be considered. These projects can target any age group.

Some project suggestions are:

- Youth-friendly social events
- Environmentally conscious activities (recycling, re-use)
- Community gardens, art activities or workshops
- Sponsorship of charitable / awareness raising events (e.g., “a-thons”)
- An event / activity that supports Lions International Mental Health and Wellbeing service initiative

Maximum grant of \$1,000.

VETERANS

Anzac Day Commemoration Fund 2026–27 – NEW

Agency: Veterans SA

Closing: 1 December 2026

Eligibility: Local ex-service organisations, community groups, schools and local councils.

The program supports projects and programs that honour veterans, commemorate Australia’s military history and preserve stories of service:

- Projects that educate the community about Australia's military history.
- Commemorative services and local history initiatives.
- Memorial creation, repairs, and improvements to spaces used for reflection.
- Support for veteran wellbeing and dependants

There is no minimum or maximum funding amount that can be applied for within the total \$100,000 that is available for distribution this grant round. The grant process is competitive, and applications may either be funded in full, partially funded or not funded at all.

Saluting their Service Commemorative Grants Program

Agency: Department of Veterans' Affairs

Closing: 21 January 2027

Eligibility: Must be one of the following entity types:

- Company
- Cooperative
- Corporate State or Territory Entity
- Incorporated Association
- Indigenous Corporation
- Local Government
- Non-corporate State or Territory Entity
- Non-corporate State or Territory Statutory Authority
- Partnerships
- Person
- Sole Trader
- Statutory Entity
- Unincorporated Association – only for Community Grants (up to \$10,000).

Community Grants

Grants up to \$10,000 are available for projects and activities that:

- are focused on the local community
- commemorate the service and sacrifice of local community members
- are primarily accessed by the local community.

Major Grants

Grants between \$10,001 and \$150,000 are available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or broader regional perspective. These projects may include the construction of new war or peace memorials where none currently exist, as well as additions to existing memorials.

COUNCILS

Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council - Community Asset Grant

Agency: Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council

Closing: 9 October 2026

Eligibility: local organisations within the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council.

This community-focused grant offers an opportunity local organisations to invest in their community, fostering growth and improving communal spaces.

A maximum grant of \$10,000 is available per project.

- For projects less than \$3,000 in total value no contribution is required by the applicant.
- For projects greater than or equal to \$3,001 in value, a minimum co-contribution of 1/3 of the project costs is required (please see Section 7 – Financial Guide).

Projects are sought which will have long-term benefits to communities of the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council Region.

District Council of Mount Remarkable - Community Assistance Program

Agency: District Council of Mount Remarkable

Closing: 11 September 2026

Eligibility: non-for-profit, incorporated community groups located within District Council of Mount Remarkable area.

The Community Assistance Grant Program serves as a resource for community groups to secure funding for projects that might be challenging to obtain from other sources. These projects, activities or events should clearly demonstrate a positive impact on the residents of the District Council of Mount Remarkable.

For the 2026/2027 Community Assistance Grants Program the available grant pool totals \$30,000. Eligible organisations are encouraged to apply for a maximum funding amount of \$5,000. Applicants may submit more than one application if desired.

Community Development Funding

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: local organisations within the Regional Council of Goyder.

This funding is available throughout the year (unless funds for that financial year are exhausted) and will be presented for consideration at the relevant Council meeting.

Community event funding is available to support events held within the Council area, with broad appeal to both the local and wider community that celebrate significant occasions, encourage cultural diversity or bring communities together. An Event Management Plan will need to be provided as part of the application.

Maximum Funding \$2,000

Port Pirie Regional Council - Community Assistance Fund

Agency: Port Pirie Regional Council

Opening: July 2026

Eligibility:

- Not-for-profit community group or organisation
- Un-incorporated applicants may apply under the auspice of another incorporated organisation
- Operate within the Council area or be auspicing an activity that will take place within the Council area.

The purpose of the fund is to encourage and support community initiatives that respond to local needs, enhance community well-being and quality of life and are of benefit to our residents.

It is aimed at providing non-for-profit organisations, community and sporting groups based in the Council area with the opportunity to obtain funds for projects or events which cannot easily be obtained from other sources.

Grant funding of up to a maximum of \$4,000 is available for financial and/or in-kind assistance per application, per organisation, per year.

Funding is offered 4 times a year. Applicants may submit one application per funding round.
